Regarding the Bexhill West Station project, a number of meetings have been held at different locations, some at the West Station, others at the colleges in Hastings and Eastbourne. We arranged a small parade of vehicles along Bexhill seafront to Cooden Beach Hotel and then on to the West Station restaurant after the Bexhill carnival run on 25th July to try to promote the development.

Apart from all the interest in the Bexhill West project, there is still a firm interest in the idea I suggested to Ion Castro (HTRG) for a transport site in Hastings, next to the town's main museum off of Bohemia Road. Ion told me that Kevin Boorman (HTC) was also interested in the idea. Ion said he visualizes a building big enough to take the trolleybus 'Happy Harold' as well as one or two trams with tram track in a building designed to look like a tram building.

Derek and myself have been working at Robertsbridge building the end of the lean-to which is now finished and we have also laid 7 ¼" track to run the mini tram up and down on. We have also built a shed to the rear of our workshop which will give us extra space but there are still lots of things to be done.

We have had lots of interest from visitors to the site in recent months.

I was interested in finding out if we still had the tram chassis and small part of extramcar No 43 which had been stored at a site off Rock Lane, Hastings almost 10 years ago. On making enquiries, I was told that it had all been cleared away and it was now gone, but I asked if I could check it out just to satisfy myself. The good news is I found what I was looking for, hidden away behind lots of old junk. To my surprise, I also discovered the chassis which was originally built by the Dover Museum and used on No 43. I also found a small broken bulkhead section of tramcar 43 which was also deposited there along with the chassis. This I soon had tied to the roof rack of my car and is now safely stored at Robertsbridge.

News has reached me by club member Wendy Butler that sadly ex-member Robert Carnie has died. Bob left the club and moved up to Norfolk a few years ago to be nearer his family and friends, like lan he was blind. They both attended many of our meetings and will be sadly missed.
