WORK AT STAPLECROSS By Roy Austen

Work at our new site at Staplecross is progressing steadily. The club has recently purchased some new fencing for the site and it has now been fitted beside the trams despite a couple of set-backs! As we began preparing the ground for the fence posts, we discovered that the entire area was covered in a thick matting material. This is used by the the nursery to prevent weeds growing through the top soil. Trying to get through it was not an easy task! Then, we hit another problem (literally!). When we first moved to the site, we had re-routed some blue plastic water pipe used by the nursery for watering so it avoided our site. Forgetting that we had done this, as we dug down for the new fence posts, we hit the pipe with a spade and went straight through it! Thankfully, the pipe wasn't under mains pressure at the time so we were soon able to stop the leak and repair it.

The next major task was to try and add some roofing over the trams to protect them from the elements. We are in the process of joining some roof panels onto the fencing to stretch over-top of the two trams to try and cover them completely.

We hope that the gap between the two trams can be used for displays. We have already



enclosed this area using some old roofing and floor panels from Robertsbridge so it's looking quite good. We've even added an old glass door to the front to allow easy access!

I am currently trying to get a large print or mural of a old tram postcard made up to fill in the gap.

In the meantime, our new member Helen has been busy at work rewiring



some old electrics on the site and has fitted a power socket to allow us to use tools etc. more easily. Helen was also keen to develop a workshop at one end of our site so we could store our tools securely. All our tools from Robertsbridge had previously just been piled up in one corner! In the last few weeks, she has acquired a shed from the Midlands and has been busy fitting it out as our new workshop.

Derek has also been busy reorganising the Cosy Club Mk. 2 so it has larger capacity. The sink and cooking area has as been improved so it's now even easier to stop and have a cup of tea! We have also installed a new water pipe which means our sink now even has running water!

The weather hasn't been particularly favourable to us over the past few months but I think we are progressing in the right direction!
